- Understand the possible risks and take action to keep safe.

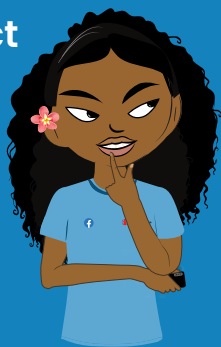
Begin Today
